



Chiang Mai University Announcement
on Changes in English Proficiency and Skills Examinations
Before the graduation of final year undergraduate students
(CMU-eGrad) 2021 Academic Year

According to the regulations of Chiang Mai University on Undergraduate Education year B.E. 2561, Item 21.2 (4), Rules of Chiang Mai University on education for the degree of Doctor of Medicine and Bachelor of Science 2018 degree, Article 21.2.1 (4) and Article 21.2.2 (4), Chiang Mai University Regulations on the study for the Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine degree and Bachelor of Science degree in Veterinary Science, B.E. 2561, Article 21.2.1 (6) and Article 21.2.2 (6), Chiang Mai University Regulations on education for the Bachelor of Pharmacy degree and Bachelor of Science degree 2018, Article 21.2.1 (6) and Article 21.2.2 (6) and Chiang Mai University Regulations on education for the degree of Doctor of Dentistry and Bachelor of Science 2018 degree, item 21.2.1 (4) and item 21.2.2 (4), it is stipulated that students who are admitted to a Bachelor's degree from the 2018 academic year (Code 61) onwards will be able to graduate if they pass the English language proficiency and skills test for Chiang Mai University students prior to their graduation as announced by the university.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the preparation of the English language proficiency test cannot proceed normally and this affects undergraduate student codes 61 and 62 who are expected to graduate in the first semester of the 2021 academic year. By virtue of Section 35 and 38 of the Chiang Mai University Act B.E., the university would like to provide the following guidelines:

1. Undergraduate student codes 61 and 62 who are expected to graduate in the first semester of the 2021 academic year are exempted from taking the English language proficiency test before graduation in their last year of their undergraduate studies.
2. If the student wishes to test their English knowledge and skills, the university will hold the CMU-eGrad Examination for Semester 1, Academic Year 2021 on Tuesday 26 and Wednesday 27 October 2021 for a total of 2 days for undergraduate student codes 61 and 62,

or expected graduates code 61. This is for students expected to graduate in the first or second semester of the 2021 academic year and who must attend cooperative education, vocational training, internship and other training in the second semester of the 2021 academic year. Students may register following these steps:

2.1 For undergraduate students code 61 and 62 or code before 61 who are expected to graduate in the first semester of the 2021 academic year, students must use their own IT Account (@cmu.ac.th) to register, choose an exam date and period in the Microsoft Form via <https://cmu.to/egrad2021> from now until Sunday 10 October 2021 at 8:00 p.m. The university will notify the students of the examination period, date, and location via email with the domain @cmu.ac.th by Friday 15 October 2021.

2.2 For undergraduate students who are expected to graduate in the second semester of the 2021 academic year who must attend a cooperative education practice, vocational training, internship or other training in the second semester of the 2021 academic year, the Faculty should survey students who wish to take the CMU-eGrad exam and report their names, along with specifying the date and time they wish to take the examination at the university through the Academic Coordination Center to coordinate the exam registration for the students. The university will confirm the examination period, date, and examination location to students via the students' email @cmu.ac.th by Friday 15 October 2021. The CMU-eGrad exam is taken on-site, thus COVID-19 measures are strictly followed.

3. The University will provide the CMU-eGrad exam in the second semester of the 2021 academic year for undergraduate students. In addition to items 2.1 and 2.2, the examination schedule will be announced at a later time.

4. In the event of a problem with compliance to this notice, the President may announce changes as deemed appropriate.
