

## Chiang Mai University Announcement Subject: Applying for an Income Supplement Project to support students who are struggling financially due to the COVID-19 outbreak for 1<sup>st</sup> semester of academic year 2020

With regard to the University's policy to support Chiang Mai University students affected by the Coronavirus Disease outbreak in the 1st semester of the 2020 academic year, an Income Supplement Project has been created in order to help alleviate the financial stress that students may be experiencing due to COVID-19.

Chiang Mai University is accepting applications for the Income Supplement Project to help struggling Chiang Mai University students affected by the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) for the 1<sup>st</sup> semester of academic year 2020.

## 1. Application Conditions:

1.1 Must be a student of Chiang Mai University (any level)

1.2 Students are paid 40 baht per one hour of work, with the limit not exceeding 8 hours per day.

1.3 Throughout the semester, students may work no more than 125 hours per month, not exceeding 5,000.- baht per person per month.

## 2. Application Procedure:

2.1 Students can search and apply for jobs via the CMU Student Information System (SIS) by filling in the job application form. Students are advised to search for jobs between 1-14 July 2020 and job selections or interviews will be announced via the CMU SIS.

2.2 If the student is employed, they shall start work at a time specified by the employer, starting no earlier than the  $8^{th}$  July with the last possible day of employment on the  $30^{th}$  October 2020.

## 3. Work Remunerations

3.1 Employers shall send reports of the student's work performance to the university and it shall be used as proof of work for salary payments by the 20<sup>th</sup> of each month (July-October 2020).

3.2 The Finance Division will pay the student's salary directly to the student's bank account by the end of each month that the student has worked (July - October 2020).
